Designed for students and families, this combined exhibit and program space will convey a three-part thematic message: *One Ship, One Crew, One Nation*. With the Bicentennial of the War of 1812 just one year away, this exhibit will explore the causes and consequences of the War of 1812. Old Ironsides is one of the most nationally significant artifacts from the naval War of 1812.

Big Brothers Big Sisters of Massachusetts Bay Boston, MA One-year grant in support of the expansion of the Public Housing Youth Mentoring Initiative. In addition to the Bromley Heath Housing Development, other housing developments include: Orchard Gardens, Lenox/Camden, Alice Heyward Taylor, and Mission Main. The program matches boys (age 7-12) with qualified adult mentor volunteers.	100,000	06/12
Bird Street Community Center Dorchester, MA One-year grant in support of the expansion of its Academic Support Programs in 2012. These programs include “Kids to College” (currently offered at Boston College and soon to be implemented at Suffolk University) for middle school students; Junior Achievement Program;; and individualized math tutorials for students who are not at or above grade level.	75,000	03/12
Boston Chinatown Neighborhood Center, Inc. Boston, MA Two-year grant in support of a parent training program that will promote their children’s language development and pre-literacy skills; increase parents’ involvement in their children’s education; help parents in navigating the school system and accessing resources; and prepare their children to be successful in school. (Total program support: \$100,000)	50,000	09/12
Boston Landmarks Orchestra Boston, MA One-year grant in support of an educational residency and performance project that will engage talented students attending the Conservatory Lab Charter School in a multi-faceted, music-oriented learning experience.	50,000	06/12
Boston Preparatory Charter Public School (BPCPS) Hyde Park, MA One-year grant in support of the School’s Grade 13 Program, which will ensure that students who have graduated from BPCPS receive academic and social support when they attend college. These supports include linking students to college resources and traveling to colleges to visit students. In addition, a Grade 13 Fund provides financial support to BPCPS alumni for unanticipated expenses while in college.	50,000	06/12

Boston Schoolyard Funders Collaborators Fiscal Agent: The Boston Foundation Boston, MA Two-year grant in support of its efforts to transform the remaining schoolyards in the Boston Public School system and implement Outdoor Classrooms at the sites. Neighborhoods that will be affected include East Boston, several in Dorchester, Hyde Park and Charlestown. (Anticipated support in 2013: \$50,000)	100,000	03/12
Brooke Charter Schools Fiscal Agent: Brooke Charter School Foundation Roslindale, MA One-year grant to support the acquisition and renovation of a permanent facility located next to Franklin Park which will serve as the “Brooke Mattapan” school scheduled to open in September 2013.	50,000	09/12
Campaign for Catholic Schools f/b/o Pope John Paul II Catholic Academy Braintree, MA Second and final installment in support of improving literacy in English and math of middle school students (grades 5-8) attending the Pope John Paul II Catholic Academy. The Academy serves 1,300 students on four campuses in Dorchester and Mattapan. (Total program support: \$100,000)	50,000	06/12
Codman Academy Foundation f/b/o Codman Academy Health and Education Center Dorchester, MA Second and final installment in capital support toward the construction costs of an addition to the Center, which will be jointly occupied by the school and the health center. An addition consisting of 32,800 sq. ft. will be a LEED Gold Certified green addition. Codman Academy is a college preparatory high school serving students in grades 9-12. English for New Bostonians Fiscal Agent: The Boston Foundation Boston, MA One-year grant in support of the ESOL for Parents and Caregivers Initiative which is jointly led by ENB in partnership with the Boston Public Schools Department of Adult and Community Education.	50,000	03/12
Families United in Educational Leadership a/k/a FUEL Boston, MA One-year grant in support of expanding the model that provides financial incentives and information to help families motivate and guide their children to college.	50,000	09/12

Fenway High School Fund f/b/o Fenway High School Boston, MA Three-year grant totaling \$125,000 in support of its Sustainable Plan for Technology, which will purchase up-to-date equipment so the students will have access to important learning tools that will support advanced science and math curriculum supplements, video editing programs and other educational resources. (Anticipated support in 2013 and 2014: equal installments of \$50,000)	25,000	03/12
Home for Little Wanderers Boston, MA One-year grant in support of constructing a Reading Resource Room in the new Knight Children's Center (KCC) in Jamaica Plain. The lower and upper schools will each feature two Reading Resource Rooms at a cost of approximately \$65,000 per room.	65,000	03/12
KIPP Massachusetts Lynn, MA Two-year grant in support of the "More Time" program at KIPP Academy Boston. The new KIPP school will open in Mattapan in the fall of 2012 with a founding class of 75 fifth grade students, and will grow to serve grades 5-8, with an elementary school to be added in future years. Boston, MA One-year of support of the expansion of Math*STARS Algebra I Integrated Learning Model (ILM) Initiative to 6-8 Boston Public Schools. The model combines an intensive afterschool program for 7 th and 8 th graders preparing for, or enrolled in, Algebra I with targeted math teacher development and coaching.	50,000	09/12

Northeastern University College of Professional Studies Boston, MA Two-year grant in support of “Foundation Year”, which is a first-year college program that helps underprepared Boston area high school students develop the skills they need to become successful college graduates. (Total program support: \$100,000)	50,000	09/12
The Food Project Dorchester, MA One-year grant in continued support to develop the Greenhouse as a sustainable enterprise, generating enough revenue through produce sales to offset the costs of operating the Greenhouse. The Greenhouse serves as a neighborhood hub for the Build-a-Garden raised-bed gardening program and the new Grow Well, Eat Well, Be Well workshop and event series focusing on gardening, cooking and nutrition education. (Total Dudley Greenhouse support: \$225,000)	100,000	03/12
